#### A message from your principal, Dr. Travis

I hope this update finds you well.

As we quickly approach Winter Break, I wanted to remind the YHS community that the last day of 1st semester is Friday, January 19th. While January 19th seems so far away, we only have 18 instructional days left before the semester concludes. With that end in mind, I encourage each family to take some time this weekend to review your student(s) academic progress and to work collaboratively with your student to create a plan to reach a successful conclusion to the semester. For those families looking to see some improved performance or just to verify how your student is doing, here are some recommended next steps you can take.



- Collaboratively review with your student their graded assignments in Canvas or through Home Access Center to ensure all assignments are complete.
- Verify with your student and their teacher(s) to determine if there are any missed retake opportunities and/or missed assignments.
- Collaborate with your student's teachers to understand the relearning process for any potential retake opportunities.
- Reach out to your student's teacher(s) to understand what steps you can take to support your student in any upcoming class work.
- Make a commitment with your student to participate in ACCESS daily (see <u>link for teacher ACCESS</u>
  daily availability) or FlexBlock (see <u>link for teacher FlexBlock availability</u>) with their teachers.
- Please note that teachers have the ability to temporarily flip a student's ACCESS/Lunch to align to their availability.
- ACCESS requires a "pass" from the teacher in advance; FlexBlock does not require a "pass" unless noted by special school-wide announcement.
- Students have 18 ACCESS opportunities (25 minutes each) and 8 FlexBlocks (55 minutes)
  between now and the end of the semester to seek improvement. Don't wait ~ the time is now!

As I shared at the onset of this semester, the collaborative partnership between the home and school is paramount to our collective success. We are absolutely blessed with an amazing staff of caring professionals who will do whatever they can to help our students succeed. I counsel all of our students

to use the precious remaining days to take full advantage of the available resources and services to reach a successful conclusion to their semester.

#### Course Selection Process for 24-25 School Year

Starting on November 29 through December 13, 2023 students will have the opportunity to submit course requests online through the Home Access Portal. Home Access Center will close on December 13th at 3 pm.

Prior to doing so, we ask all families and students to review <u>THIS INTERACTIVE TUTORIAL</u> that will take students through our departmental course sequencing as articulated by our Division Chairs. Additionally, there is information as it relates to AP, Dual Credit, IVVC, Field Experience, and work-based learning opportunities.

One-on-one course selection appointments will begin December 11th through January 24th. Appointment times will be sent out via email to students in advance. Students supported with an IEP will have their case manager present at their course selection appointment during their Access class.

band was invited to share this concert and treated extremely well as honored guests!


## **Holiday Coat Drive!**

# Why participate in PSAT/NMSQT & SAT Test Prep?

Historically, students who have participated in test preparation programs have scored higher, on average, than their counterparts who have not taken advantage of a prep program. We believe that all junior students at YHS would benefit from extra preparation prior to the SAT this spring, as well as sophomores who plan on preparing for the fall PSAT/NMSQT test.



A PSAT/NMSQT & SAT score shows a student is prepared for post-secondary education and can open the doors to enrollment at the college or university of your student's choice, as well as increase scholarship opportunities. Please take advantage of this opportunity to prepare your student.

#### What is Test Prep?

Starting in January, we will be offering a preparation program that will include 7 workshops – each lasting 2 hours. During each workshop, students will rotate through different sessions (English, Reading, and Math) in order to improve their skills in each of those three areas.
